The Employee Handbook

Policies to live by

In today’s ever changing workforce, it becomes necessary for every employer to set aside some basic guidelines and mileposts for its employee to follow. The best method of achieving this is to set up an employee handbook. Handbooks can come in several sizes, some large others small enough to carry only the basics. Depending on your company, choose the type that is best for your business.

A good handbook should cover several areas: the rules and regulations that coincide with federal laws, policies regarding vacation and other time off, an Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) statement, a brief description of the benefits, evaluations, discipline procedures and other information relating to the company.

First Step in Establishing a Communication Link

The last newsletter discussed how important communication is to an organization’s success. With that in mind, the Kaua’i Chamber of Commerce has established a

means by which members can communicate and provide feedback to the various committees of the Chamber. This is our first survey and its primary purpose, as the first survey, was to see how well it would work.

We tested the survey on two audiences, one with board and committee members and a second with a general audience of members and partners of the Chamber. We had 111 responses.

The idea is to keep it simple and easy. Initial feedback indicates that it was easy and quick to complete. We designed the survey to take you immediately to a result page so you could match your response to those that had responded before you. If there were no other responses, then you beat everyone to the survey. The following is a final tabulation of the results.

The first question asked why you joined the Cham-

ber. Sixty percent of respondents answered that networking or supporting the community of Kaua’i as the top reasons for joining. The majority of board and committee members attended 8 or more events. Sixty-two percent of general members attended three or less. The most popular events were Quarterly Dinners and Business After Hours.

Thirty-nine percent of respondents rated the Chamber’s image with the business community as very favorable. Only 17% of the board and committee members rated the Chamber’s image as very favorable. Seventy-six percent of our members believe that the Chamber has a good image with non-business groups although many of the board and committee members think it needs improvement.

We asked some issue questions as well. Sixty-four percent of respondents support the Super Ferry and less than half believed an environmental impact statement should be done.

Another purpose of the survey was to get a better sense of who our members are. The majority of the respondents came from businesses with 10 or less employees. The majority of businesses were in the
